Hollman Gardens

This bright four-bedroom house with private garden, garage and off-street parking can be found on Hollman Gardens, a popular no-through road of mid-century townhouses built in 1970.

Internal accommodation extends to approximately 1,250 sq ft and is arranged over three levels. On the ground floor is a large bedroom/study and a utility room with shower, both with access to the garden. There is also a guest WC and an internal door to the garage which has the potential for conversion.

On the first floor is an open-plan reception with living and dining areas. Large French casement windows provide lots of light and a wonderful sense of openness, overlooking the south-west facing garden below and playing fields beyond. The kitchen, which retains its original cabinets, is separate, connecting to the dining area via a sliding glass divider.

Behind an original reeded-glass wall, stairs ascend with a hardwood balustrade to the upper level where there are three further bedrooms and a family bathroom.

Crystal Palace is a approximately 15 minutes by bus, and is a vibrant area with award-winning restaurants and bars as well as having a thriving arts and music scene.
