This large Modern house (approximately 2,200 sq ft in size) is located in a quiet corner of South East London and was designed by the renowned architect Joyce Lowman. It is a 5-bedroom property with a good-sized garden, two reception rooms, a garage and large, light spaces throughout. Although now in need of some updating, many of the best original features remain.

The house is one of a pair designed by Lowman in 1971, the other smaller one (sold by The Modern House in 2011) for Lowman's own occupation and this one for a favoured client. Intelligently working with a sloping site, Lowman has created a series of south-facing spaces that create an exciting internal layout, a level garden and a first floor balcony from which far-reaching views towards Biggin Hill and Surrey beyond can be enjoyed.
